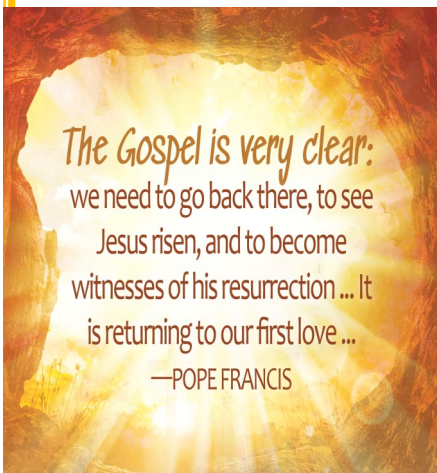
Today the Easter Vigil has regained its rightful place as the most important ritual of the year and as the primary celebration of Easter. This happened first in 1951 by way of experiment and was finalized in 1955. In its renewal form, the Easter Vigil is almost the same as that in early centuries, except that the ritual takes about two hours rather than all night. It has four clearly defined parts: the service of light, the liturgy of the word, the celebration of baptism, and the Eucharist.

The renewal of the Easter Vigil has resulted in what seems like two Easters in the typical parish. Each year however, the Easter Vigil is becoming for more and more parishioners what it had been in its origin: the night of all nights and the primary celebration of resurrection, or Easter. The renewal of the adult catechumenate in parishes has added an important feature to the Easter Vigil that had been lost for centuries: the baptism of adults. For other parishioners, Easter Sunday morning Mass, officially the second Easter Mass, is still the Easter experience.

The elaborate and beautiful ritual of the Easter Vigil calls for extensive preparation by the parish team and many other parishioners. The church is decorated, sacramentals of oil, incense, water and fire are readied, and the liturgy is rehearsed. Adult catechumens begin their final hours of preparation.

Until recent decades Holy Saturday was a day of fasting and partial abstinence (meat was permitted only at the principal meal) in preparation for the greatest feast of the year. This discipline of fasting continued even when the solemnities of the Easter Vigil were celebrated during the early morning hours of Holy Saturday, concluding with all the joyful overtones of Easter. It was a reminder that the mystery of Easter was still associated with the night hours and early Sunday morning.

In recent years this tradition of fasting has returned with the renewal of adult catechumenate. Adults preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil usually spend some time in a mini-retreat with fasting and prayer as the hours of the Easter Vigil approach.
