

The Third Sunday of Advent - REJOICE

This week begins with the wise King Solomon. He is followed by two great prophets, Elijah who was carried up to heaven in a chariot of fire, and Isaiah who foretold the birth of Jesus. God again reveals his loving concern for us in the stories of Daniel, who was spared death in the lions' den, and Jonah, who survived three days in the belly of a whale.

As we approach the time of Jesus, we learn the story of Zechariah and Elizabeth, the parents of John the Baptist. John was the prophet who preached the coming or the Messiah and baptized Jesus himself.



An **Advent calendar** is a special calendar used to count the days of <u>Advent</u> in anticipation of <u>Christmas</u>.

Consecutive doors or windows are opened every day leading up to Christmas, beginning on the start of the Advent season for that year.

Often the doors are distributed across the calendar in no particular order. The calendar windows open to reveal an image, a poem, a portion of a story (such as the story of the Nativity of Jesus), or a small gift, such as a toy or a chocolate item. Often, each window has a Bible verse and Christian prayer printed on it, which Christians incorporate as part of their daily Advent devotions.

Our "Advent calendar", on the sides of the tabernacle, is slowly letting in the light as we await the light of the world, Jesus, our Savior's birth.
