

The 2019 Bishop's Appeal marked 65th anniversary since Bishop William A. Scully first appealed to the generosity of the faithful in the context of a diocesan wide campaign, asking all Catholics to assist his

efforts in building up the Church of Albany. We are very grateful to Edna chase who has successful managed the local campaign for several years.

The chair is responsible for following the Leadership Manual, updating the Parish A-Z List of parishioners, ordering BA envelopes, receiving the mailings which include the posters, brochures, imprinted pledge cards, blank pledge cards and volunteer envelopes. The kick-off weekend involves the in-pew commitments being made out and collected. The actual appeal can be done by the chairperson, finance chair or priest.
