

- 4) How many Holy Days of Obligation are there in the United States? **6**: Christmas, Ascension, Mary, Mother of God (Jan 1), Immaculate Conception (Dec 8), Assumption (Aug 15), All Saints (Nov 1). However whenever Jan1, Aug 15, Assumption or Nov 1 falls on a Saturday or Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated)
