

Ministry of the week
Money Counters – have a very responsible job and are subject to audits. That said it is a great way to be involved in your parish. There are internal guidelines established so that all money is counted with a second person to verify, starting with using the Tamper Proof

bags that the collection is put into. These numbered bags are logged in the back of church when money is put in and again when the money is removed. Money counter keep track of all donations: envelopes cash and checks as well as loose cash and checks. The fill out a tracking sheet so all moneys given for a specific purpose are deposited to the correct account and also so donors may receive an end of the year statement, if desired, of funds donated. The next step is the bank deposit slip listing checks and cash & putting that all in tamper proof bags to go to the bank. The bank, upon opening the bags, tallies and credits our account and returns the receipt from the bag they opened. All work can be traced to ensure you that we do not take your donation for granted. A team of two counters is assigned each weekend; if you would like to help in this way, please call the office 607 547-2213. Thank you to all our great money counters!
